Incontinence Care


Incontinent residents are at an increased risk of developing UTIs. Be proactive in assisting incontinent residents and change undergarments frequently.

Ensure that your residents are wiping from front to back after urination and bowel movements to prevent bacteria from spreading.





Catheter Care

When working with residents that have indwelling urinary catheters, make sure that the bag is adequately emptied, not twisted or kinked, and below the level of the bladder.
